## General Chair Report

General Chair Report 2021 PNS House of Delegates Status Summary

This last year has been very loooooooooong! I have spent more time in front of a computer screen (Zoom!) than I ever did in my professional career as a computer software specialist. We could commiserate for hours about the isolation and other negative impacts of the COVID pandemic, but consider the "silver linings in the pandemic cloud" in terms of the accomplishments despite the environment and the limitations imposed by COVID:

- Clubs persevered despite the lack of pools and strict regulations on participants.
- Athletes found new ways to exercise and maintain their mental balance.
- PNS established a presence in Olympia and provided significant influence on the swimming regulations published by the Department of Health.
- The LSC, the Board and committees completed the transition to a virtual meeting environment that permits greater participation and avoids rush hour commuting.
- The coaches formed a communications network that used their ingenuity to develop safety protocols, share best practices and develop competition structures for intrasquad meets.
- PNS formed relationships with other amateur sports organizations and began the process of cooperation with "umbrella" sports coalitions.
- With the need for additional pools, PNS has created a task force to begin the arduous task of supporting coalitions that will build or remodel aquatic facilities.
- PNS achieved recognition as a Level 3 LEAP LSC under the revised USA Swimming program for appropriate governance, programming, and communication.
- Clubs have established much closer and much more cooperative relationships with facility managers as everyone worked to create the safety protocols that permitted a return to practice.
- Over 25% of PNS member clubs have completed the Safe Sport Recognition Program.
- DEI initiated the first trainings to improve the inclusiveness of both local swimming in general and PNS specifically; thereby starting the organization on the path to eliminating any aspects of systemic racism and inequities.

These are the first of many small steps for the LSC. Planning for competitions continues to evolve as many hundreds of "return to water / competition" plans have been tossed into the wastebasket. Planning will continue as situations and regulations change, but I remain optimistic that multi-team, Prelim / Final, championship meets that create goals and excitement are in the immediate future! The organization has learned

many lessons from these experiences and where those lessons have improved the environment, will need to be incorporated into the "new normal" of the future.

It has been an honor to serve as the General Chair for these dedicated volunteers, the coaches, and the athletes who are the reason the organization exists.

## Administrative Vice Chair Report

2021 House of Delegates Administrative Vice Chair Report

As the Administrative Vice Chair for our LSC it has been a busy year making sure that our bylaws are in compliance with USA Swimming requirements as well as Washington State Law. We found out that our association name that was listed in our Bylaws did not match the Articles of Incorporation that are on file with the Washington Secretary of State. The associations name had been incorrectly changed in 2008 when USA Swimming required LSC's to update their bylaws. USA Swimming requires LSC's to use a model template to work from. LSC's were again required to update their bylaws in 2018/2019 using a new template. We again ratified our Bylaw's in June 2020 at last year HOD. In the fall of 2020 I discovered the discrepancy in our Bylaws not matching our Articles of Incorporation. Upon correction of the association name, we conducted an electronic vote with the House of Delegate earlier this year to ratify our bylaws.

USA Swimming requires all LSC's to complete the LSC Evaluation and Achievement Program (LEAP) every two years. USA Swimming rolled out a new evaluation program and Pacific Northwest Swimming was part of the second group of LSC's to complete the review. LEAP requires a thorough review of our governance structure, programming offerings and communication structure of our organization. We had the month of February and March to complete this review. We passed our review and will need to complete the review again in 2023. LEAP is a very extensive review of how our LSC operates and while it was a very time-consuming endeavor it really shows that our LSC operates in a manner that benefits all the members in our LSC. Our Outreach Program was noted as being one of the best throughout all LSC's. I want to thank the other board members and committee chairs that helped gather the information needed to submit to USA Swimming to compete the review by the deadline.

USA Swimming requires each LSC to sign an Affiliate Agreement which has a direct correlation to LEAP. It was determined that we were missing several required policies as part of the Affiliation Agreement and LEAP. This required 7 new policies to be developed for the LSC to ratify at the House of Delegates this year. If the LSC is not compliant with the Affiliate Agreement it can have negative consequences to the LSC, primarily the LSC being decertified by USA Swimming. If the LSC is decertified it would mean that USA Swimming could revoke our ability sanction meets by the LSC.

The PNS website was upgraded to the new CMS platform this past weekend. We found that the old platform has some limitations that prevented us from doing a few things we wanted to do. The new website gives us more flexibility and in the end will help all of our members find information on the website a little bit easier.

We have 3 blocks of legislation that we will be voting on during House of Delegates this year. Block 1 are amendments that pertain to Policy changes recommended by the Board of Directors. Block 2 are the new policies that are required as part of the USA Swimming Affiliate Agreement and LEAP requirements. Block 3 are amendments to the Bylaws. The proposed changes can be found on the Proposed Legislation document.



# Finance Report

### Pacific Northwest Swimming - Finance Report

2020-2021 is the second year of the pandemic and we have seen a 76.4% drop in Meet Tap income and a 33.3% drop in USA registration income.



(note: 2020-2021 is actuals through April Month End)


With most meets canceled, program expenses have been significantly lower.

USA Swimming created a Covid-19 Relief program for teams and encouraged LSCs with the financial strength to provide supplementary grants. Thanks to the foresight of PNS leadership in the early 2000's, we have a robust reserve account. We have drawn upon our reserve to support teams with grants totaling \$473K. As of April 30, we still have a balance of \$843,516 in the reserve account.

As we finish the year, we will draw upon our reserve account to participate in major upcoming meets and Olympic Trials. PNS remains in strong financial shape.

### Summer 2021 Meet Update:

- 1) Please fill out the <u>survey</u> to let us know the status of your team/pools.

We ae still holding out hope to be able to have some sort of season ending meet at WKCAC. However, should that not be available, TPC is looking for some alternatives. If you have a pool that might be able to look at hosting some sort of event, please make sure to put that on the survey.

### Pacific Northwest Swimming Meet Plan-2021-22

### Short Course Part 1 (September 1-January 16th)

- All weekends are designated Special Weekends so teams can adjust to the needs of their local community in regard to capacity guidance.
- October 9-10, October 16-17, October 23-24th have been reserved at WKCAC to run a 'short course series'. Time standards TBD but likely Gold. Teams will be assigned a weekend to compete (by end of July).
- 3) October 30th or 31st: distance meet at WKCAC. (tentative)
- 4) December 10th-12th: 14 & under champs at WKCAC (BC host)
- December 16-19th: Senior Champs at WKCAC (KING host)
- December 2<sup>nd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup>: Husky invite at WKCAC (Husky host)
- 7) January 13-16th Washington Open at WKCAC (VAST host)

Hosts will be solicited for the October meets in Mid-June with bids due at the end of June.

### Short Course Part 2: (January - March 31st):

- More information will be available in early Fall with the hope of returning to a more normal calendar for the winter challenge, February AGI, & Spring Showdown.
- March 9-13th Senior Sectionals
- Age Group Regionals & potential spring showdown are awaiting exact date from WKCAC.

#### Long Course Season (April 1-August 1st)

 More information will be available in early fall with the hopes of returning to a more normal long course season. Teams that were awarded bids for Long course meets in 2020 will have first right of refusal for similar weekends.

For all seasons, communication for renting of WKCAC should go through PNS Scheduling.

## Senior Report

### Senior Report – 2020-21

Much of the past year has been spent working in conjunction with the board and other coaches to put together a viable season for athletes while navigating the everchanging landscape of Covid guidelines and pool space. The coaches' rep suggestion of hiring of a lobbyist has paid big dividends in by representing our interests with local government and the health department by promoting a safe, orderly, logical reopening plan. Much of our time on the board and in small groups has been sharing information on best practice in practice and meet proceedures throughout this swim season.

#### PNS Club assistance round 2

Several Coaches on the board took part in creating a viable PNS assistance plan. This season there was a second round of funding this included:

- Provide individual help for teams that need assistance with completing governmental aid applications. Teams needing assistance can receive up to two hours of support.
- Offer members the opportunity to apply for a Club Improvement grant.

#### Virtual Dryland Coverage

USA swimming now covers teams for virtual dryland activities. We've canceled the outside policy but are covered by USA swimming.

#### **PNS Senior Budget**

The Senior Budget was reduced significantly as part of the overall Budget Cut. Less funding will be available for travel overall, and thus far in 2020-21 there has been minimum spending. The majority of the travel funding has been earmarked for this summer as we anticipated the country opening up for travel during this time. We did not anticipate the March Senior Sectional meets being moved to Arizona / Utah and made the decision not to fund as it wasn't in the budget and it was agreed that more athletes would be willing to take advantage of travel funding as states begin to lift Covid Restrictions during the summer. Priority should be given to trials the later summer competitions.

## Age Group Report

#### PNS Age Group Report

LSC

Age Group Zones set for Aug 4-7 in Lewisville, TX (Dallas area)

After much discussion with PNS coaches, PNS will participate in the zone meet and we are working on posting the application information which will all go out as soon as we have the meet announcement and full scope of how the meet will run this year.

We will NOT travel as a team, all swimmers selected to our zone team will be responsible for travel and lodging to the meet.

Stay tuned for details to be announced.

#### NATIONAL

The pandemic has been tough on everyone, but especially our 12&unders and the younger you go the harder it has been. With Seniors getting first dibs returning to pools many teams across the country are still struggling to schedule our younger age groups.

At national age group committee, we are working on programs to help restore, revitalize and reenergize our youngest age groups. We are working on a 12&under "summer league" program which will be soon announced that provides clubs the ability to host short/fast/fun meets a la summer league meets and introduces a new meet type designation & events to the rulebook.

#### LOOKING AHEAD

We are GO for the All Star meet in January, we will announce details as they are made available to us.

We are looking at camp opportunities for PNS swimmers, especially an open water camp.

#### FINAL THOUGHTS

I would just encourage everyone to share some gratitude and love to our youngest swimmers. Please thank these families for staying positive and patient as we work our way through this pandemic. We know it has been tough on their swimmers, but we are getting through this and our age groupers will be back in full action before you know it. We have not forgotten about our age groupers in PNS and we can't wait to have everyone back at a big normal meet racing each other!

### ATHLETE REPORT

- Last year we reported that we were searching for athletes to serve on committees within PNS. This year, I am happy to say that we were able to fill every athlete position on committees. Unfortunately, due to Covid, some of our committees did not meet or were not as active as they have been in the past which resulted in some athletes being more active than others.
- At a National level, PNS had 4 athletes virtually attend the USAS

- Again on a National level, there are a few proposals that we feel
  you should be aware of. In order to maintain compliance with
  the USOPC (United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee)
  USA Swimming is proposing changes to the make-up of the
  National House of Delegates. While there are many changes, the
  ones we feel that will impact our athletes the most are as follows:
  - o33% of the voting membership of HOD must be either a "10-Year Athlete" Representative or a "10- Year+ Athlete" Representative.
  - o11 members of the AEC and 8 additional LSC Athlete Representatives (2 selected by each Zone Director by consent from the Coach and Non-Coach Zone Director) shall be members of HOD.

There are 40 clubs in PNS with a total of 4,456 athletes; however, 10 Clubs have no officials. [For comparison, as of 31 May 2020, 52 clubs with 6.450 athletes. Not every club had an official – 17 teams w/ 1,059 athletes have no officials [30.4% of teams, 16.4% of athletes] and 35 Unattached Officials.]

<u>Bottom line:</u> The "ideal" ratio (recommended by USA-Swimming) is closer to 10.0:1. Therefore, we encourage all teams to help us in recruiting more officials. Please contact any (or all) of the Officials Committee if you have suggestions.

While coaches and athletes are encouraged to understand the rules (affecting both the administrative and in-water aspects), a reminder of two rather significant rules changes occurred last year impacting competition.

- a. 102.1.6 Requirements for Virtual Meets <sup>1</sup>
- b. 102.8.1 F Technical suits banned for 12&U athletes (except Jr Nats, U.S. Open, Nats, and Olympic Trials) <u>effective 1 Sep 2020</u>. For mor information on what suits are compliant, please see the USA-Swimming discussion of Tech Suit Ban for 12-and-unders [https://www.usaswimming.org/news/2020/08/24/tech-suit-restriction-for-12-and-under-swimmers]. <u>The burden of knowing if a suit is compliant is really on the parent, coach, and swimmer</u> (i.e., PNS officials will not be asked nor expected to be the 'suit police' but should a non-compliant suit be noticed, the athlete risks a disqualification for wearing an illegal suit.)
- 4. I am extremely proud of the reputation that officials from our LSC have across the nation. As an indication of the level of excellence, we are honored to report that two PNS officials are on the FINA Officials lists: Lisa Vetterlein (Jan 2019-Dec 2022) and Mike Murphy (Open Water Jan 2020-Dec 2024). Further, Lisa Vetterlein and John Gagliardo have been selected to officiate on the Olympic Team Trials deck in Omaha during the first 2 weeks of June while Bernadette Witty and Deborah Soper will be officials at the Paralympic Team Trials in Minneapolis later in June. These selections are a testament to the caliber of your PNS Officials!
