General Chair Report

2022 PNS House of Delegates

Status Summary

As the PNS House of Delegates completes the annual planning cycle, competitive swimming is in a very different environment than at this time last year. The current meet calendar is radically expanded although not yet totally recovered. The "return to competition" took longer than anyone anticipated but multi-team, Prelim / Final, championship meets are again happening! The 2021 – 22 season experienced continued restrictions, but 2022 – 2023 offers the potential for a more complete spectrum of competition opportunities. The past year included:

- Clubs continued the small, special meets to provide opportunities (albeit limited) for competition despite the on-going regulations on participants.
- PNS conducted an extensive search and interview process and Melissa Stiner became the new Office Manager / Registrar.
- Colleen Buchanan retired as the "voice" and PNS guide / consultant after over 20 years of outstanding service.
- Due to the summer long closure of WKCAC, there was no local Long Course Competition.
- When WKCAC finally opened with reduced capacity and capability, PNS clubs took advantage of other meet cancellations to host three weekends of capacity limited competitions for the entire LSC.
- PNS maintained a presence in Olympia and began preparations for the 2023 capital budget cycle.
- Although the number of clubs has shrunk almost 20% from pre-COVID operations, swimmer registrations are over 90% of the 2019 numbers.
- Clubs and teams from other regions came again to WKCAC to compete at the Washington Open.
- The slow process of reopening pool facilities to clubs continued into 2022 for some sites.
- When staffing limitations at WKCAC forced the relocation of the March Senior Sectionals Meet to another venue, PNS provided \$50,000 of supplemental Travel Reimbursement funds to support swimmers traveling to the new, remote site.
- WKCAC and PNS welcomed swimmers from Inland Empire and Oregon to the Washington State Age Group Championships in March.
- With the need for additional pools, PNS has supported efforts to build or remodel aquatic facilities. The LSC also co-sponsored the coalition that is bringing together the various pool building efforts around the Puget Sound Region.
- As USA Swimming continues to reinvent and restructure the former Convention and Annual USAS HOD calendar, PNS supported coaches, staff and athletes

who physically attended the inaugural Spring Workshop. The attendees were able to learn about current activities in various disciplines as well as network with their peers in other LSC's.

- PNS extended the application deadline for clubs to request Team Training funding for Outreach Swimmers to address concerns in the process.
- Current WKCAC parking limitations due to the on-going COVID test site were addressed by negotiating use of local Federal Way school parking lots.
- The planned Long Course season has started and will include more opportunities than ever as a result of the availability of WKCAC.
- The Athlete representatives will host a webinar with Olympic Champion Megan Jendrick in mid-June.
- The July meet calendar includes both the Age Group and Senior Long Course Championship Meets.

The future is not yet entirely clear as there remain challenges that must be addressed:

COVID variants seem to be an on-going worry.

Access to facilities remains uncertain and could alter the planned meet schedule.


USA Swimming and the Center for Safe Sport are introducing new requirements and obligations.



Senior Vice Chair Report

2021-2022 marked a return to the aquatic center and the ability to hold some championship PNS meet.

PNS swimmers were represented in several national events including Speedo Winter Juniors and Phillips International Team Trials.

As KCAC could not host Senior Sectionals. As such, there was no PNS supported champs meet for swimmers with Senior Sectional Qualification times. PNS voted to allocate \$50,000 to support Senior Sectional level swimmers to travel to the approved event of their choice. These events included Multiple Senior Sectional Meets & Senior Zones.

189* Swimmers and 21 Coaches submitted travel requests by the April 30 deadline. Each share for reimbursement comes out to approximately \$238.00 per confirmation of athlete eligibility.

Athlete Funding Moving forward into Summer and 2022-23.

Mid Season a survey was sent out to all Senior coaches to determine priority meets for funding in the upcoming seasons. Coaches shared that the largely supported meet funding for meets at the futures level and above. Meets such as Senior Zones would no longer be a priority for funding as the funds were being spread across too many meets to actually make a significant impact for individual atheltes.

ATHLETES REPORT

2022 House of Delegates Athletes Report

This past year has been an exciting and busy experience for all of us newly-elected athlete reps. Originally coming in with little board experience, we've taken huge leaps towards embracing our roles and engaging with the community. In hindsight, we are proud to have launched several unique projects, and coming off a successful USA Swimming workshop in Denver, expect many more to come.

- The year began with a joint college swimming seminar with the Oregon LSC. Former PNS/Oregon collegiate athletes from all different backgrounds volunteered their time to engage in a Q&A session with current athletes. Held over Zoom and advertised through social media, there was an impressive turnout of athletes and parents/guardians.
- One of our main long-term projects has been revamping the @pacificnorthwestswim
 Instagram account. We have been posting regularly, highlighting college commitments,
 swimming records, submitted pictures, and more. Moving forward, PNS's social media
 presence will continue to serve as an important medium of direct feedback and
 representation of our athletes.
- Utilizing these new connections with athletes, we advertised committee participation with
 the hopes of encouraging new faces to bring their perspectives directly to the board.
 Recently, this has taken the form of incentivizing participation with a raffle for USA
 swimming gear. We have seen a significant increase in athlete interest in committees and
 hope to continue growing it in the future.
 - The Athlete Committee in particular saw the most reform. We have been working throughout the year to solidify the role of the committee, and have taken advantage of the platform to plan several of the following projects. Around 20 athletes indicated they were interested in the Athlete Committee in the most recent survey.
- Athletes have also expressed enthusiasm for clinics and guest speakers. Thus, we have dedicated the majority of our budget to hold a webinar and Q+A session with former Olympian and gold medalist, Megan Jendrick.
- Beyond hosting solely informational events, we wanted to interact with athletes in a fun manner. We took advantage of the 202(1) Olympics and hosted an Olympic Challenge on Instagram, in which participants would guess event winners for a chance to win a gift card prize.
- Moving forward, we have several new project ideas from our workshops in Denver, including a biweekly newsletter written by athletes for athletes and an end of the year LSC-wide banquet. Although we were able to begin refining these ideas at the convention, these proposals are still in the works and will likely be coordinated by the Athlete Committee in the near future.

These are only the first steps towards solidifying the role of athletes on the board. We are deeply appreciative of our opportunity to serve in our positions and look forward to working more closely with PNS athletes in another productive year!

From data available in the Officials Tracking System (OTS) on the USA-Swimming website (housing our "officials logs"), excluding Novice/training work, from 1 May 2021 to 20 April 2022, PNS officials worked nearly 7,400 meet sessions (recall that some/most meets have more than one session). If we assume an average session is 3.5 hours, approximately 25,900 volunteer hours were worked by our officials in the past year!

Despite all of these hours, we can use more officials! Given that there are approximately 6,099 athletes in PNS, our Athlete-to-Official ratio is roughly 17.5:1, much higher than the target ratio of 10:1 (or less). Therefore, we encourage all teams to help us in recruiting more officials.

We are proud to report that our LSC had 3 officials at the Olympic Team Trials (Lisa Vetterlein and John Gagliardo in Wave I with Ron Van Pool in Wave II^a) and 2 officials at the Paralympic Trials (Deb

Soper and Bernadette Witty) in 2021! Additionally, at the recent International Team Trials meet, there was one PNS official on deck (John Gagliardo). All of these meets are an Invitation Only deck which speaks to the caliber of your PNS Officials for being invited.

Finally, I will be stepping down from the Officials Committee Chair position effective 1 June. David Guffey has been selected to become the next Chair and Nick Siripipat will be the Vice Chair. Ed Lesnick will assume the duties of Secretary for the Committee.

- 1. After notice by Pacific Northwest Swimming:
 - a. An athlete member has 15 <u>business</u> days to replace a returned check plus service fee. After 15 <u>business</u> days the athlete shall be suspended from competition until receipt of the sum due.
 - b. A non-athlete member has 15 <u>business</u> days to replace a returned check plus service fee. After 15 <u>business</u> days the non-athlete shall be suspended from USA Swimming activity <u>until receipt of the sum due</u>.
- 2. Upon receipt of bank notification of a returned check issued by an PNSA Club (i.e., a USA Swimming, Group Member), the PNS Office Manager shall notify the Club that such Club will be on the agenda of the next Executive Committee Meeting to determine whether any disciplinary action should be taken. Regardless of whether the Executive Committee determines that disciplinary action is appropriate, such club shall reimburse PNS for PNS's costs incurred as a result of a returned check. If such Club fails to reimburse PNS of its costs or fails to make payment of (if any) other amounts determined by the Executive Committee, such Club's USA Swimming membership shall be terminated.
- 3. PNS Returned Check Policy for checks written by teams or for team entry: First returned check: \$50 fine, probation for three years (may continue to use team checks) Second returned check (within three year period): double face amount of check (minimum \$50), extension of three year period from date of second check and requirement to pay by secured funds (ex: cashier's check or money order) for three years. After three years without a returned check, a team may use team checks to pay for fees and start over on returned check policy.
